a little farther afield

- **Asahi Japanese Steak House**—Offers the three-ring-Japanese-slash-and-burn grill, but walk past that into the serene setting of the sushi bar, where you'll find some of the best sushi this side of the Pacific Ocean.
- **Bert's Seafood Grille**—Bert's has a hip, casual air and stellar service. With some of the freshest fish and seafood on the planet dished up in eclectic preparations.
- **Biancas' An Italian Eatery**—Proves that you and your date can have a romantic evening and get stuffed to the gills without breaking the bank. The food's strictly old-style Italian, a little bit on the heavy side, but well-prepared and served with Old World style.
- **Bistro Sofia**—Crisp service, an excellent wine list and all the other appurtenances of fine dining, set in a house reminiscent of a French country inn. Food: Haute cuisine, featuring elaborate and tasty combinations, with exquisite sauces.
- **Cafe D'Arte**—Designed with elegance and privacy in mind, whether for a romantic evening or a dinner meeting, with Old World service.
- **Casaldi's Café**—Dishes up some of the Triad's best Italian grub, but it's certainly not fancy. Think of a bright, airy bistro with a glass counter behind which you'll find homemade veal stew, several interesting salads prepared from fresh ingredients, handmade pasta and made-fresh-daily desserts, served by a family straight from the Old Country.
- **Ruth's Chris Steak House**—Easily the Triad's premiere expense-account steakhouse, with a jazzy, New Orleans decor. Food: The area's only U.S.D.A.-certified Prime beef, cut into sizable steaks cooked in ovens that reach 1,800 F, served with traditional sides and salads.
- **Saigon**—A Greensboro institution with a national reputation, where you can find well-prepared Vietnamese food in an atmosphere that's a little bit elegant, a little bit eccentric. Can you say caramelized pork or hoisin-basted quail?
- **Southern Lights**—An ever-changing menu designed around fresh ingredients, reasonable prices, and a broad and eclectic list of wines by the glass packs them in.
- **Taste of Thai**—The best value and the most consistent food of just about any restaurant in the Triad—Asian or otherwise. The crisp, obliging service combined with the atmospheric, exotic setting completes the picture.
